


Companion curriculum for GOALS "Hockey Stories"

Mario Lemiuex is considered to be one of the greatest players in hockey history. In fact some of those who are also considered to among the greatest – legends like Wayne Gretzky and Bobby Orr, openly say that Mario Lemieux was the most talented person to ever play hockey! Lemiuex had a couple of fun nicknames. Can you name at least one of them?______ How about the other one that was popular (in French or English!)______.

Mario Lemieux was born in the city of ______ which is located in the country of ______. As he grew up, his hockey skills were better than anyone. When he was 18 years old he was the #1 draft pick by a team that was struggling in the National Hockey League. That team was the

Lemieux proved to even better than people thought he would be. He scored his first NHL goal on his first shift and first shot of his career. He quickly emerged as arguably the best player in hockey at a very young age. In 1987 he was named to a national "Team Canada" and led his team to a unique championship against other national teams in the famous "Canada Cup" series. He scored more than 25% of the goals for ________ in this tournament against the best players in the world.

In 1993 at the young age of just 27, Lemiuex was diagnosed with a form of ______. He underwent medical treatment but returned to play for his team just 44 days later! Amazingly he scored a ______ and had two more ______ in that game, and he went on to win the scoring title in the NHL!

Finally, by 2005 he retired for good but became the majority owner of the team he had played for during parts of 17 seasons. By then he was ALREADY a legend, voted into the Hockey Hall of Fame and to further cement his legacy, a large statue was placed outside the arena where his team played. Truly a champion in ALL ways, Lemieux continues his inspirational hockey leadership today!
